ABC Order- Write our words in alphabetical order.	Backwards Words- Write our words forwards, then backwards.	Scrambled Words- Write our words, then write them again with the letters mixed up.	Write It Out Old School Style- Write our spelling words neatly 4 times each.
Flashcards- Make flashcards to study your words.	Other Handed- If you are right-handed, write with your left-hand and vice versa.	Words in Words- Write your word and then write 2 words made from each word. For example: return- ten, run, rut	Silly Sentences- Create silly and funny sentences. Sentences can contain up to 2 spelling words, but you must underline the spelling words.
Colorful Words - Write each word in 2 different colors using different colors for vowels and consonants.	CV List- Write our spelling words that start with a vowel on one list and words that start with a consonant on another list.	Picture This- Draw a picture that illustrates the meaning of each spelling word.	Syl/la/ble Words - Write our spelling words divided by syllables. Example: exclamation= ex/cle/ma/tion.
Crossword Puzzle- Create a crossword puzzle using ALL of our spelling words using clues to solve it. Print an answer key if possible. www.crosswordpuzzlegames.com/create.html	Word Search - Create a word search using ALL of our spelling words. www.armoredpenguin.com/wordsearch or www.varietygames.com/VS	Secret Agent Words - Number the alphabet from 1 to 26, then convert your words to a number code.	Type it Out – Type each spelling words 4 times. Experiment with different fonts, but I have to be able to read it.

<p>Synonym Words - Write each spelling word and list 1-2 synonyms. For example: happy: glad, content</p>	<p>Antonym Skills - Write each spelling word and list 1-2 antonyms. For example: awake: asleep</p>	<p>Fabulous Parts - Categorize our words according to parts of speech (nouns, verbs, etc).</p>	<p>I Typed It, Now Pass It – Type a letter to a friend. Underline the spelling words.</p>
<p>Rainbow Words- Write your words and trace over them in 3 different colors.</p>	<p>Ransom Words- Cut letters out of newspaper, magazines, or write them out on paper and cut them, then glue them together to build your words.</p>	<p>Look/Say/Cover/Write/Check- You may get the activity sheet from your teacher or you can do it on your own in your notebook.</p>	<p>Shaving Cream Words- Write your words out in shaving cream. Parent initials required in spelling notebook.</p>
<p>Tracing Words- Trace your words in sand, on felt, in the carpet, using your finger. Parent initials required in your spelling notebook.</p>	<p>Word Hunt- Search for your words in books/texts or around the house. Write your words as you find them.</p>	<p>Font-abulous- Type your words in 3 different fonts on the computer.</p>	<p>Chalk Talk- Write your words in chalk. You can do this activity with a dry erase board and marker too. Parent initials required in the spelling notebook.</p>
<p>3 Way Words- Write your words three ways, really big, really small, and in your best handwriting.</p>	<p>Word Boxes- Write your words. Then make boxes around each letter.</p>	<p>Trace & Spell- Have someone write your words neatly. Trace the words spelling out each letter in the word.</p>	<p>Spelling Sentences- Write the word, use it in a sentence, write the word. Ex. cat I have a cat named Bangs. cat</p>
<p>Pretest- Take a pretest. Check over each of your words. Write any incorrect words 3 times each.</p>	<p>Silly Riddle Words- Write a riddle for each of your words. Include a clue about how the word is spelled. Solve your riddles.</p>	<p>Word Chains-Write down each spelling word. Change one letter to make a new word. Challenge: See if you can go back to your original word.</p>	<p>Word Strategies- Come up with a strategy to help you learn each of</p>
